What Does your Normal Workday Look Like?

I hold many courses during a year – in Denmark as well as all around the world. We instructors also take part in correcting catalogues and installation instructions. We may also assist R&D in testing new products and the like. I was employed in R&D for 11 years, before I started as an instructor at the LOGSTOR Academy.

What Do you Like about your Work as an Instructor?

At the LOGSTOR Academy not 2 days are alike. I meet many different people with each their life stories, while travelling around the world. Sometimes it is possible to extend the stay a couple of days and take a closer look on the part of the world you are visiting. Once I came to work Monday morning and the next day I was on a 1st class flight to Australia to start-up a project for 3 weeks.
